

TRUSTEES AND OFFICERS MEETING

August 8, 2022

President Terry Rudes opened the meeting at 7:09 p.m. and served as Chairman.

The minutes of the Trustees & Officers Meeting of July 11, 2022 were read. The minutes were approved as corrected.

Treasurer: The financials were e-mailed to everyone. Accounts are balanced. The investment accounts have taken quite a hit due to the current recession.

President's Reports: President Rudes reported several club members have participated at the nationals at Camp Perry. Mike Gargac shot in the Vintage Sniper Match. Richard Rudes and Jeremy Best also shot the Vintage Sniper Match and finished in 4th place. Allison Schultze received a gold medal in the Garand Match and was the High Junior. Quite an honor for a national competition. Jenna Boykin, one of our junior rifle shooters, received a gold medal in the Rimfire Sporter Match. Steve Hutton won 2 silver and a gold in the Pop-up handgun match and attended the small arm firing school. Congratulations to everyone!

President Rudes reported Habitec came out to fix the door handle but were unable to fix it. The programming system for the fobs has been upgraded and is working better with fewer problems.

Vice President: The new propane contract with Beck Oil has been paid. The 2023 Budget has combined the C3 and C4 into one operating budget. C-3 and C-4 accounts are still being maintained separately, but the new budget format makes it easier to track where club monies are being expended.

Committee Reports: Darr Report: Tony Tyson reported there were 6 members, 1 non-member, and 3 ODRN representatives at the turtle/frog class. It was a very good class. The ODNR representative from the Athens area would like Tony to do a turtle/frog class in his area.

The Lima area is adopting our US Fish and Wildlife program. They also would like Tony to meet with the congressional committee on this.

The WRP came to evaluate the south side of the Darr and finalize last year's report.

Scott Storrer reported they have gotten a lot of acres mowed this year since it has been a dryer year.

Bud Baringer reported Kevin Jacob and Nate Stott are working on the youth grants. They should now have all the paperwork and receipts from 2021.

Bud also gave an update on the backhoe brake repairs. He could not find any business that would work on it. He had Ryan Hetrick come out and run it. He made several suggestions/options:

1. Make maximum adjustment and see if it is functional and safe to use and continue to use it until it is no longer safe and then sell it.
2. He can take off parts, take them to his shop, make repairs, return them and reassemble for \$6,000 to \$10,000. Problem is that parts may not be available for a tractor that old or may take a long time to locate and obtain the needed parts.
3. If we do some of the removal and reassemble we can save \$1,000-\$2,000.
4. We could do adjustments and then sell the tractor while it is running. Right now the market price is high. Could sell now and purchase another when the prices come down.
5. Another option would be to sell the backhoe assembly and keep the tractor to use as a power plant for a mobile pumping unit.

Bud is recommending doing the adjustment and see how long it lasts.

Old Business: None

New Business: Terry Warner asked if we were going to pay for the diesel used by the person who is working ground at the Gordon Road property. Terry Warner made a motion to pay him, Joe Hein seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Bud reported he borrowed a truck and hauled trash to the landfill at a cost of \$42 which was paid by Dave Roepke. Terry Warner made a motion to reimburse him, Joe Hein seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Terry Rudes reported there are a lot of programs coming up. We are in need of instructors, coaches, RSO's, and volunteers. He has also been getting a lot of questions on the new no carry law. He requested permission to use the club for a law seminar on August 31, 2022 from 6-9 P.M. at a cost of \$20 per person or \$10 for members. All money collected will be given to the club. Steve Hutton moved and Bud Baringer seconded the motion to approve the class. Motion carried.

Tony Tyson reported the dog trials are August 20 & 21. So far 200 dogs are registered. Trials start at 7:30 A.M. to 5 P.M. Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be served Saturday and breakfast and lunch on Sunday. Any help would be appreciated. He also reported they will be shooting pigeon August 27th from 2 p.m. till dark. They are asking for a \$5 donation to help cover the cost

of pigeons. They will also have the appreciation dinner of pulled pork and sweet corn. Please come and bring a dish to share. They will have the gun raffle just before Christmas.

The following individuals were recommended to be approved for membership: Rickey Rahm and Charles Bronston. Terry Warner moved and Bud Baringer seconded a motion to approve these individuals for membership. Motion carried.

Good of the Order: Scott Storrer reported they are pumping water on the Darr prior to the WRP coming on Friday.

Steve Hutton moved and Terry Warner seconded the motion to adjourn the meeting.
